Whole School Attendance

We are so proud of the overall attendance of pupils at St. Gregory's. We are so passionate that all children attend school every single day, as attendance is so vitally important to children's success at school.

Although we aim for 100% attendance, each year we set a target of at least 97% attendance. If your child has over 5 days of absence across the whole school year, then they will not achieve this target. You can make the biggest impact on your child's attendance, and we appreciate your help in trying to achieve this.

In line with Government guidance, the policy is that leave of absence during term time will only granted in the most exceptional circumstances. We take a firm stance in <u>not</u> authorising holidays during term time due to the impact that this has on pupils' education.
