### **EYFS & KS1 Nativity**

Our Reception and Key Stage 1 Nativities will take place on Tuesday 9th December at 9.30am and 2.30pm and our KS2 Carol Service will take place on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> at 9.30am and 2.30pm. These are ticketed events to ensure we do not overcrowd the hall, so you must show your ticket at the door. If you don't bring your ticket, you may need to wait for us to see if there is space available later. Please don't be offended by this. A link will be sent to you to submit your preference. Tickets will be sent home this coming week.

### **Christmas Parties and Discos**

Pupils will have their Christmas parties and disco throughout the day on Thursday 12th December. Pupils can come to school dressed in their party outfits. School will provide the party food and DJ, but we do ask for a small donation of £2.50 towards this cost. You can pay for this through Parentpay, or your child can bring cash into school.

### **Memory Tree**

In our main entrance, we have a special Christmas 'memory tree'. We invite families to dedicate a star decoration in memory of a loved one. We will send the stars home for you to complete with your child and return to school to be placed on the tree.

### **Polar Express Day -All Aboard!**

As part of our Christmas celebrations all pupils and staff are invited to our 'Polar Express Day' on Friday 13th December. As part of the day, each child will receive a 'train ticket' and can come to school dressed in their pyjamas. Children will enjoy literacy activities linked to the Polar Express story in the morning and then watch the film with hot chocolate in the afternoon!

### **Online Safety information for parents**

Our pupils are growing up in a world of ever-changing technology. While we feel that the use of technology is a largely positive aspect of modern life, we cannot ignore the risks that can be associated. Often children receive electronic devices for Christmas so now is a good time to remind our pupils how to ensure they are safe online.

Throughout school we aim to teach children:

- About the impact of cyber-bullying and what to do if they have been affected.
- To be vigilant when communicating online recognising that people may not always be who they say they are and to be sensible about what they share.
- To tell an adult they trust if something is upsetting them.
- To question the reliability of information given through a web based source.
- To search responsibly for information while using internet browsers.
